Voting on SB157 broke down largely on regional lines, with West River lawmakers almost unanimous in opposition and most of the more numerous East River lawmakers supporting the bill.

Rapid City lawmakers have tried several times to defeat the bill. They had their only success last week, when by a 34-33 margin the House amended the bill to strike the limitation on advertising technology bans.

But a conference committee of lawmakers restored the bill's original language, with some minor changes.... "

# Threat of more mega-billboards

"On March 6, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) will consider on second reading an ordinance sponsored by Commissioner Bruno Barreiro which enlarges the existing extensive Miami mural ad zone with two ordinance amendments...

At the February 15 meeting of the Miami-Dade County Commission Infrastructure and Land Use Committee, Comm. Bruno Barreiro's two proposed enlargements were approved.

One is south of NW 5th Street along the Miami River, including historic Lummus Park, low rise residential homes except for a few mid rise residential towers, facing I95, Spring Gardens and the River.

condo residents who will face the mural ads and Miami River Commission and Scenic Miami/Scenic Miami-Dade representatives testified against this enlargement.

The proponents represented the outdoor advertising industry and one politically active property owner who wants the mural ad on the walls of his residential building. The City did not appear at the hearing to ask for the enlargement. The public hearing was closed...

...Sponsor Commissioner Barreiro amended his ordinance again to include an area west of N. Miami Ave between NW 36th and 37th Streets.

This is the first enlargement of the mural ad zone near Mid-Town, Buena Vista neighborhood and Design District area that juts west of N. Miami Ave near I 95.

Commissioner Barreiro called a representative from the outdoor ad industry to the podium to ask him to address the amendment which is for the benefit of 3650 N. Miami Ave.

The public hearing did not reopen and the committee voted 4-0 to send the ordinance with both amendments to the BCC for second reading (not a public hearing).

These billboards on buildings are supposed to be in the "urban core" and now are permitted from SW 8th St up I 95, along the Miami River, along 836 to NW 14th Ave, along NW 20th St, down I-95 to 395, up NW 2nd Ave to NW 37th St and down NE 2nd Ave., over 19th St to Biscayne Bay to S. Miami Ave.

This is a very large area which is defined as the "urban core".

Miami residents and visitors downtown, in Mary Brickell Village, in Spring Gardens, in the hospital district, in Overtown, in Mid-Town, in Buena Vista, in the Design District, in the Upper East Side now are assaulted by ads everywhere."

Note from the Editor

Suggestions for improvement are always welcome.

As a result of the Department's review, this letter is written to advise you that the Department is prepared to take all appropriate steps to assure that Bill Salter Advertising, Inc. (Salter Advertising), complies with the letter and spirit of Chapter 479, Florida Statues.

The Department has concluded that Salter Advertising failed to submit a vegetation mitigation plan and also failed to surrender 54 non-conforming signs as required by Section 479.106, Florida Statutes, and Rule 14-40.030, Florida Administrative Code, for vegetation management permits issued in 2009.

Accordingly, the Department demands that Salter Advertising promptly submit a vegetation mitigation plan for the subject 61 sign sites (110 sign facings), identify the 54 non-conforming signs it will surrender, as well as pay an administrative penalty under Section 479.106(7), Florida Statutes..."
